The Consumer Electronics Show

For many years, the Association of PC User Groups (APCUG) has scheduled its annual meeting to coincide with Comdex, the international computer show held every November in Las Vegas. This year, however, Comdex was canceled, and APCUG changed its meeting to the first week of January, immediately preceding the 2005 International CES (Consumer Electronics Show).

CES was a very different type of show, and its size (huge), attendance (over 140,000 attendees from 115 countries), and energy contrasted sharply with the lackluster computer shows, both in NYC and elsewhere, of recent years. There were more than 2,500 exhibitors with a wide variety of products in such consumer technology areas as audio, video, home networking, mobile electronics, and wireless. The many floors, each with a specific type of electronics, were generally crowded, and many booths had lines. Even four solid days would not suffice to cover it fully.

Security for Battlefield and Home

Of particular interest was the PackBot EOD for Explosive Ordnance Disposal (getting rid of land mines, etc.). This robot and others like it are designed to function where it's too dangerous for people to go.



They are manufactured by the iRobot Corporation's Government and Industrial Robotics Division. This is the same company which manufactures the Roomba robotic vacuums.

There was also a wide array of home security electronics systems. A child-friendly smoke alarm seems especially useful: rather than a confusing ring, it tells the children, by name, in the parent's voice, to "leave the house NOW, and meet us at the Green's." Another system can remind the householder, via a buzzer or via the Internet, that the stove has been left on.

Sight and Sound

The displays of digital television, with image quality ranging from standard to enhanced to high definition, were truly impressive. The hundreds of models included Plasma TVs, rear projection TVs, and LCDs able to double as computer monitors. Until this show, I was not impressed by the idea of HDTV, even at more than five times the sharpness of today's television. Now I am! (But I was glad that I wasn't making a purchase decision just then.)

The massive audio floor seemed dedicated to the concept of sound immersion. There were many ways to turn automobiles into "boom boxes," and couches into "surround-sound."

Bringing elaborate electronics into the home means that the home must have furniture to hold it, and CES did not disappoint here. This section included utilitarian metal stands attached to wall or ceiling as well as gorgeous hardwood entertainment centers.

There was a floor devoted to "traditional" computer technology. Some of the most interesting exhibits here showcased small computers or components, such as the Shuttle desktop and the ultraportable OQO. Several companies specialize in rugged tablet computers and PDAs. Of course, the emphasis on mobile and wireless applications continues.

Incidentally, I regard the CES website to be one of the best "expo" websites I have seen. It is easy to navigate and remains timely a month after the show. Take a look at it: <http://www.cesweb.org>

Some Thoughts

Frankly, I was somewhat disturbed by the Audio Floor, with its many devices devoted to shutting out the sounds of the world around us. From automobiles to sofas, there seems to be a dynamic thrust to wire everything for sound. Although the many devices in this area did not seem offensively loud, I found that my ears felt relieved when I went outside.

I wonder what this does to our auditory cells—or to our psyches. Whether we listen to the song of a bird, the murmur of a child, or even a warning sound from a car engine, it seems that there are times when our ears need to be alert, rather than immersed in artificial sound.

Why does an SUV need five television screens? What about watching the scenery?

To demonstrate the sharpness and beauty of HDTV, Samsung and Sharp,

and a few others, turned not to action films but to nature. It was here, in front of a 60" screen showing a baby penguin with every barb of each feather sharply visible, followed by a butterfly with sunlight showing the wing structure, that I heard oohs and aahs, followed by the silence of anticipation for the next flight of beauty. I felt gratified that we humans still respond to the same loveliness that inspired the Psalmist, even if we see it in a different way. *Mary Ginsburg, pres@nypc.org*
