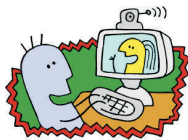

YouTube is just a little over three years old and has completely changed the way web users share video clips.

About YouTube

Here is some background information on YouTube gathered from Wikipedia:

YouTube was created in mid-February, 2005, by three former PayPal employees, Steve Chen, Chad Hurley, and Jawed Karim. Its popularity as a site for posting personal short videos has grown tremendously, and Google purchased it in 2006 for \$1.65 billion.

In August 2006, *The Wall Street Journal* published an article revealing that YouTube was hosting about 6.1 million videos (requiring about 45 terabytes of storage space), and had about 500,000 user accounts. As of February 26, 2008, a YouTube search returned about 72,600,000 videos and about 2,800,000 user channels.

In a short time YouTube has become an important factor in the 2008 presidential race. Many candidates have postings, and CNN hosted YouTube debates on major commercial television.
